
When God created the universe, he made a garden for us, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and care for it." (Genesis chapter 2: verse 15).

Gardening can be like farming in miniature. Farmers grow fruit and vegetables in large quantities for our tables and kitchens. Gardeners grow not just beautiful flowers, but fruit and vegetables too, only usually in smaller quantities! Autumn is a favourite time for gardeners because they're able to harvest the fruit and vegetables that they've been patiently tending for many months. They've waited for exactly the right time to dig up or cut down their crops.

Every gardener knows that patience is very important. Harvesting too soon would mean that the crops were not fully grown or properly ripened, but harvesting too late would result in them going rotten and being wasted.

Sometimes it's important for us to be patient and wait for the right time for things to happen. The Jews have been waiting centuries for God to send another saviour like their greatest king, King David. Christians believe that God has already sent him, Jesus of Nazareth, except God thinks in bigger ways than humans. He sent his Son to save *all* humanity, not just the Jews, and to save us from our own misdeeds not just warring neighbours, and so make us fit for *his* perfect kingdom - eternity - not just an earthly kingdom!

Being patient is a challenge, but like slow growing fruit and vegetables, growing in patience helps us grow in wisdom and maturity and helps make us fit for heaven.

Students and their parents were able to seek out advice from local companies, armed forces and training providers about options post 16 now that all teenagers must stay in education or training until they reach 18.

YEAR 11 Mock Interviews

Year 11 Mock Interviews takes place over **three evenings** in **October (Monday 17th Tuesday 18th Wednesday 19th)**. Mock interviews are an essential element in developing the skills and qualities needed by young people for their career planning and management. A mock interview can provide a realistic experience for the pupil: learning about the importance of interviews, etiquette, and also learning the basic steps and techniques for preparing and having a successful interview.

Students have to produce three pieces of paperwork:

- ✓ CV
- ✓ Cover letter
- ✓ Application form

YEAR 10 Work Experience – 26th - 30th June 2017

Launch date for Work Experience will be towards the end of October

Work experience provides many benefits, giving pupils the skills and experience that will help them to stand out to potential employers as well as helping them to choose the right sector to work in. The benefits of work experience for pupils can be substantial. Research carried out by the Education and Employers Taskforce charity found that those who did work placements while at school earned an average of £900 a year more by their early twenties than those who did not. A good placement makes young people more realistic and able to make informed career choices. It helps the young person develop the skills employers are looking for and the benefits are not limited to one industry. It helps pupils to prepare for getting up every day, going into work, and doing the routine elements of work. There is also the more immediate impact on the pupils, one that is often visible in the immediate aftermath of pupils' work experience. They come back into school focused and become noticeably more mature.

Schools or work experience organisers will normally visit the workplace before the placement, checking the environment is suitable, that the tasks the young people will be required to do are reasonable, that Health & Safety regulations are followed and that employers' insurance is adequate. Employees do not generally need to be checked for any criminal records.
