### **Sacrifices - It's the little BIG things that count.**

We all make sacrifices every day. We have had a fantastic summer of sport this year and I invite you to ponder for a moment the sacrifices that Team GB athletes competing in this year's Olympics and Paralympics have made through their life. Perhaps family gatherings they have missed due to a rigorous training schedule, no 'Cheeky Nandos' with friends, less time with loved ones, continuous physical and mental energies, early mornings and constant dedication to ensure they are as prepared as they can be in order to represent Great Britain on a global stage. A huge honour but one that came with huge sacrifices.

However, sacrifices aren't always about bettering our own lives or perusing our dreams.

*This week's Gospel is from Luke (16:19-31). It's a difficult message to hear but it is a parable many people think about in terms of serving the poor. In this passage, we hear about Lazarus, the man who spent much of his life hungry and poor and living in stark contrast to a rich man nearby. Eventually, Lazarus was taken into Abraham's arms by the angels whilst the rich man was sent to Hades, a place of pain and torment.*



*The rich man called out asking Lazarus to help him but Abraham said, 'My child, remember when you lived? You had all the good things in life, but all the bad things happened to Lazarus. Now Lazarus is comforted here, and you are suffering.' As Lazarus got no help from the rich man during his life on earth, the rich man received nothing now.*

Think about these people, who might Lazarus represent in our world today? People who are left out, the poor, those struggling, people in our communities who feel outcast and isolated. Perhaps the sick, elderly or lonely. In our world today, Lazarus could be a refugee or the homeless. Maybe someone in school who is a little bit different or unique.

Your challenge this week is to pray for these people and perhaps make a special effort to not be like the rich man but to help those people around us, in whatever way we can. Making little sacrifices that make a big difference to someone else such as giving our time, giving money to charity or offering our prayers for those in need.
